

However, according to Psychologist Karl Maslow, we each have an innate need for love and belongingness. I'll further propose that we genuinely need a love that is given freely and unconditionally.

1 John 4:7-21 explains where we can find freely given and unconditional love. The love that fulfills our innate needs is found in God. Psalm 139 reiterates that God is love, and through David's Psalm, we learn who God is and who we are to Him, beloved beyond all measure.

"Beloved, let us love one another; for love is from God, and he who loves is born of God and knows God. He who does not love does not know God; for God is love." -1 John 4:7-8

David shows us that ...

God intimately knows us, "For you formed my inward parts, you knitted me together in my mother's womb." Psalm 139:13

2. God is always with us, "Where shall I go from your spirit? Or where shall I flee from your presence?" Psalm 139:7. Spoiler alert, the answer is nowhere.

• **3.** God purposefully made us, "I praise you, for I am wondrously made. Wonderful are your works." Psalm 139:14

VIHFA Grant - Our Lady of Charity Transitional Homeless Shelter






√ The Virgin Islands Housing Finance Authority
