

The purpose of the trip was to play with the Love City Pan Dragons, at the Annual Congressional Black Caucus Conference's Prayer Breakfast. The CBC is a legislative caucus within Congress that aims to put forward legislation to support Black Americans and marginalized communities.

The V.I. Delegate to Congress, Stacey Plaskett was the one who requested pan be played and

Ian Samuel made sure that the Love City Pan Dragons represented the Virgin Islands at this event, with funding provided by Love City Strong.

We visited different sites such as; The United States Capitol, The Washington Monument, The Freedom Wall (The wall has 4,048 gold stars, each representing 100 Americans who died in the war) and The Lincoln Memorial. We also visited the Cultural Academy for Excellence (CAFE), an after-school music program. CAFE, provided pans for the Pan Dragons to use

> during our performance, and Ronald Lee Jr, a former instructor and former Pan Dragons member, was instrumental in securing and transporting the pans.

At first, we performed as everyone entered the building, but there weren't many people at the event at that time as yet. When we performed the second time around, we were able to give the large crowd a taste of our culture. We received a

huge round of applause, and everyone was happy with our performance.

In conclusion, we loved the trip, and we think it was a great opportunity for us to come and bless the ears of people who have never heard the sound of steel pan music in their lives and to also play alongside our friends.

Patience with others


